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REACH AHEAD 2019

Questions and Answers



What is the REACH AHEAD program?

<u>REACH AHEAD</u> is a credit-bearing transitional program available for all Grade 8 students registered at a BHNCDSB secondary school for September 2019. Students will receive a grade 9 credit for attending the 4-week program, July 2 - 26, 2019, at their designated secondary school. Registration opens January 8 and closes June 16, 2019.

Is it "first come, first serve" registration?

No, however all required documentation must be completed and submitted (i.e. student survey, student registration form including parental consent) before a student can be considered for the program.

Can students currently attending secondary school take the REACH AHEAD program?

The <u>REACH AHEAD</u> program is solely for Grade 8 students transitioning to secondary school. The daily course work will include transitioning activities.

Is there a limited number of students allowed in each program?

Enrollment is open to all grade 8 students interested in the program up to the deadline date.

When is the deadline to sign up?

Sunday, June 16, 2019

What is the location of the REACH AHEAD program?

REACH AHEAD will be held at each of the BHNCDSB secondary schools: <u>Assumption College School</u>, <u>St. John's College</u> and <u>Holy Trinity Catholic High School</u>. Grade 8 students will attend at their designated secondary school. *Please note*, in the event that a secondary school is closed due to construction, then the program(s) will be held at an alternate location and transportation will be provided.

Is transportation to REACH AHEAD locations provided?

Yes, transportation may be provided from central locations to the secondary schools. Central locations will be determined based on enrollment as of June 7, 2019.

What are the daily start and end times of REACH AHEAD?

Daily start and end times will be coordinated with transportation schedules and released closer to July.

Are there additional enhancement course fees for this course?

No, there will be no additional fees charged for the student to participate in this summer school course.

How do students register for REACH AHEAD?

BHNCDSB Grade 8 students must register via <u>Career Cruising</u> and complete the survey registration form by clicking on the <u>"Register Now"</u> button found on the main page of <u>www.bhncdsb.ca</u> or any of the <u>BHNCDSB secondary school websites</u>.

Grade 8 Students from outside of BHNCDSB who are pre-registered to attend a BHNCDSB Secondary School must complete **only** the survey registration form by clicking on the "Register Now" button on the main page of www.bhncdsb.ca or any of the BHNCDSB secondary school websites.

Will there be a Student/Parent information event?

If required, an information evening will be held and dates will be determined by each secondary school at a later date. Students will receive an invitation to attend through the e-mail address they provided when they registered. **Please note**: Schools may opt to share information via email communications or website only.

Can students enroll in the program at a school other than their designated secondary school?

Due to the transitional nature of the program, students **only** have the option to enroll at their designated secondary school.



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Can student take online and face-to-face courses simultaneously?

Taking both online and face-to-face courses simultaneously during summer school is not recommended.

What do the course codes mean?

- PAD 10 Healthy Living and Outdoor Activities
- HFN 10 Foods and Nutrition
- SNC 1D Academic Grade 9 Science

What are the course descriptions?

• HFN 10 - Offered at Holy Trinity Catholic High School and St. John's College

This course focuses on guidelines for making nutritious food choices. Students will investigate factors that influence food choices, including beliefs, attitudes, current trends, traditional eating patterns, food-marketing strategies, and individual needs. Students will also explore the environmental impact of a variety of food choices at the local and global level. The course provides students with opportunities to develop food-preparation skills and introduces them to the use of social science research methods in the area of food and nutrition

SNC 1D - Offered at Assumption College School

This course enables students to develop their understanding of basic concepts in biology, chemistry, earth and space science, and physics, and to relate science to technology, society, and the environment. Throughout the course, students will develop their skills in the processes of scientific investigation. Students will acquire an understanding of scientific theories and conduct investigations related to sustainable ecosystems; atomic and molecular structures and the properties of elements and compounds; the study of the universe and its properties and components; and the principles of electricity.

• PAD 10 - Offered at Holy Trinity Catholic High School, St. John's College and Assumption College School
The Healthy Active Outdoor Living course follows smoothly from the elementary health and physical education
program. Through participation in a wide range of physical activities, students will develop knowledge and skills
related to movement competence and personal fitness that provide a foundation for active living. They also acquire
an understanding of the factors and skills that contribute to healthy development and learn how their own choices
and behaviours, as well as various factors in the world around them, affect their own and others' health and wellbeing. Students will build a stronger sense of themselves, learn to interact positively with others, and develop their
ability to think critically and creatively. The course will focus on a variety of individual, dual, and small group activities,
such as hiking, biking, and curling to give students the opportunity to experience a variety of physical activities as they
acquire knowledge and skills related to healthy living. This course will also include the healthy living expectations and
integrate the development of living skills.

Do these credits fulfill compulsory requirements?

Yes, if the credit is needed to fulfill a student's secondary school graduation requirements it will be applied.

Can a student do both the <u>REACH AHEAD</u> and <u>Ready, Set, Go!</u> programs being offered in the summer of 2019? Yes, enrollment in both programs is permitted. Students can attend one or both programs if desired.

What is the attendance policy?

Attendance is **mandatory**. Daily attendance calls will be made. Absences that extend beyond three consecutive days or three days in total will be referred to the summer school principal.

Can Grade 8 students attending a public school participate in **REACH AHEAD**?

Grade 8 students currently enrolled in the public system and pre-registered at Assumption College, Holy Trinity or St. John's College in September 2019 are eligible to participate.
